Did you know, that being just 15 minutes late each morning means that your child would miss 10 days from school each year?



Artist Eva Sajovic has taken inspiration from Lancashire's industrial heritage to create an installation for the British Textile Biennial 2023 in Nelson.

Eva Sajovic, artist in residence at In-Situ, has been working with local community members and researching the local area for the last six months to produce her project called #end\_of\_empire.

The project features four large-scale machine knitted columns which include touch sensitive Al generated sounds taken from interviews and sound files provided by residents. Audience members are encouraged to interact and 'play' the textiles.
