Severe Winter Weather Arrangements- Heavy Overnight Snow



A decision to close the school for the day will only be taken as a last resort. It will take into account local conditions and assess the risks to children, parents and staff in making the journey to school. This decision will be taken by 7.45 a.m. taking into account travel reports on road conditions in the local area and on routes taken by staff from surrounding areas, and the weather forecast. If there is an improving weather forecast, a decision may be taken to delay the opening time of the school.

A message will be sent out via Parentmail and a notice will be placed on both the school facebook page and the school website. Please check these instead of telephoning the school office. Once the school day has started the school will always remain open until 3.15 p.m. but you are advised that should weather conditions make it necessary and if you live a considerable distance from school, then you may collect your child early if delaying this until the end of the school day may cause travel problems.

Gritting and Path Clearance. Snow does not automatically result in a school closure. If snow is on the ground and school is open, the site supervisor will endeavour to clear a path.

However, falling snow may mean that previously cleared paths become covered again. Please take care if this is the case.

If access to school is deemed too dangerous, the road up to school may be closed.


Girls Football Tournament – Monday 6th November

Martha took part in the Sue Ryder 5K starlight hike in Haworth, this was to raise money for the Manorlands Hospice. Martha raised a total of £155





If your child was born between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020, you must apply for a Reception 2024 place online. The deadline is Sunday 15th January 2024. Reception places are offered by the Local Authority. Attendance Matters

Attendance research shows that pupils who attend school regularly are more like to do well in the future. Regular attendance helps children to develop their confidence and to make and keep lasting friendships. Punctuality is also very important. School opens at 8:40am and children must be ready to learn by 8:50am each morning.

Did you know, that being just 15 minutes late each morning means that your child would miss 10 days from school each year?

If your child is absent, please ring school at your earliest opportunity and leave a message on the answerphone. If the attendance of a pupil is low or they are persistently late, parents will be contacted and asked to meet with school staff to see how this can be improved. Support will be offered to both parents and pupils as required. Thank you.
